Subject:Additions to existing articulation agreement between Pitt-Johnstown and<br/>Pennsylvania Highlands Community College

The Pitt-Johnstown faculty and Academic Affairs have developed 17 new program plans to add to our existing articulation agreement with Pennsylvania Highlands Community College (PHCC). These new program plans, representing a range of majors across the Pitt-Johnstown campus, were developed to improve access and transferability for community college students wishing to complete the baccalaureate degree at Pitt-Johnstown. Students will take courses at the community college that transfer to Pitt-Johnstown, allowing them to obtain a baccalaureate degree with four semesters of additional study on our campus.

I have attached a zip file that includes the following:

- 1) The original articulation agreement, signed on September 24, 2015, and which covered ten program plans, plus three more by addendum. These are included in the zip file under "Articulation Agreements."
- 2) The 17 new plans developed over the past year. These are included in the zip file under "New Proposals for Articulation."
- 3) Revision to course plans necessitated by minor changes to courses and programs at PHCC over the past few years. The revised program plans are included in the zip file under "Revisions to Current Articulation."

In total, we now have 29 program plans covered by our articulation agreement with PHCC. The complete list is as follows:

SUBJECT: Articulation Agreement Pitt-Johnstown and Pennsylvania Highlands Community College

The purpose of this memo is to document curricular modification to two programs that will be covered under the existing articulation agreement between Pitt-Johnstown and Pennsylvania Highlands Community College (PHCC). A copy of the original agreement that supports 10 different programs of study is attached for your convenience.

As you are aware, Pitt-Johnstown developed an articulation agreement with our neighbors, Pennsylvania Highlands Community College (PHCC) in 2015 largely as a response to the state-wide articulation agreements between the community colleges and the PA State System of Higher Education.

Since the time the original agreement went into effect, there have been minor changes at PHCC that affected the Psychology curriculum, and in addition, our faculty approved one additional articulation in Computer Science – both the traditional and applied tracks. I have attached the current advising sheets for all three programs, and am requesting that we add them as addendums to the original agreement. Specifically, the programs we are requesting to add to the agreement are the following:

- PHCC Computer Science (A.S.) to Pitt-Johnstown Computer Science/Standard Track (B.S)
- PHCC Computer Science (A.S.) to Pitt-Johnstown Computer Science/Applied Track (B.S)
- PHCC Psychology (A.A.) to Pitt-Johnstown Psychology (B.S) replaces previous advising sheet

The courses listed on the advising sheets are on the approved list of transfer courses between our institutions. Following the plan, students at PHCC will not lose credits upon transfer to Pitt-Johnstown, and will be able to complete the bachelor's degree part of their program in the 4-year timeframe. The attached advising sheets have been reviewed and approved by the faculty at both institutions, as documented by the signatures below.

The University of Pittsburgh at Johnstown (UPJ) and Pennsylvania Highlands Community College (Penn Highlands) hereby enter into this agreement governing the transfer of credit by Penn Highlands graduates who have earned an Associate of Arts (A.A.) in Liberal Arts and Sciences, who follow the relevant Program Advising Plan, and who apply and are accepted into a Bachelor degree program in the disciplines listed on the attached appendices at UPJ.

This agreement, effective on the date signed by the responsible authorities below, will be in effect for a maximum of five years at which time both institutions will undertake to negotiate a new agreement. Due to the dynamic nature of curriculum, the courses comprising this agreement will be reviewed on an annual basis to ensure continued equivalence of course content and student learning outcomes. Furthermore, this agreement is subject to institutional compliance with all state, local, and federal laws as well as compliance with policies of the relevant regional accrediting body (MSCHE).

For Penn Highlands Liberal Arts and Sciences (A.A.) graduates admitted to the UPJ Bachelor degree programs listed on the attached appendices, UPJ will:

- 1. Transfer the courses and credits as indicated on the individual Program Advising Plan into the relevant UPJ Bachelor degree program on the condition that the individual course grade is C or higher and in accordance with current UPJ transfer credit policies.
- 2. Apply the courses and credits directly to the degree program as outlined so that A.A. graduates may enter at Junior standing with little or no loss of credit.
- 3. Periodically review the performance of Penn Highlands' graduates who matriculate at UPJ assessing academic preparation and success at UPJ and share these data with Pelm Highlands. This information will serve as a metric for evaluating the success of the agreement and grounds for renegotiation of the agreement at the end of the aforementioned five-year period.

As part of this agreement, Penn Highlands and UPJ will:

- 1. Publicize this agreement among its students, faculty, staff, and the general public.
- 2. In all joint or individual promotions of the Penn Highlands/UP J agreement, identify Penn Highlands as the provider of the first two years of a Bachelor degree at UPJ and UPJ as responsible for the remaining courses in the major and the final two years of the Bachelor degree.
- 3. Monitor the academic performance of students enrolling under this agreement. Identify problems and work cooperatively to adjust details of course sequence and content so that students can transfer with no academic disruptions.

- 4. Arrange articulation meetings to address concerns, discuss curriculum changes, and identify additional potential areas of cooperation between the two institutions, and to train staff on the terms of this agreement.
- 5. Notify each other of any contemplated curricular changes that would affect the future of this agreement. Arty curricular changes implemented by Penn Highlands affecting its A.A. in Liberal Arts and Sciences degree programs will result in a reevaluation by UPJ of credit transferability as set forth in the Program Advising Plans.

#### Renewal, Termination, and Indemnification:

- 1. Either patty may terminate this agreement effective at the end of an academic year by giving written notice to the other institution's president at least 180 days prior to the end of the academic year.
- 2. This agreement can be terminated at any time by the mutual written agreement of the institutions' presidents.
- 3. To the extent permitted by law, UPJ shall save, indemnify, and hold harmless Penn Highlands and all its respective agents, employees, and successors from all claims, liability, suits, and actions resulting from or arising out of the activities of UPJ or its officers, employees or agents acting under this agreement.
- 4. To the extent permitted by law, Penn Highlands shall save, indemnify, and hold harmless UPJ and all of its respective agents, employees and successors from all claims, suits, and actions resulting from or arising out of the activities of Penn Highlands or its officers, employees or agents acting under this agreement.

This agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original, all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument.

THIS AGREEMENT CONSTITUTES THE ENTIRE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE PARTIES. NO WAIVER, CONSENT, MODIFICATION, OR CHANGE OF TERMS OF THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BIND EITHER PARTY UNLESS IN WRITING AND SIGNED BY BOTH PARTIES. SUCH WAIVER, CONSENT, MODIFICATION, OR CHANGE, IF MADE, SHALL BE EFFECTIVE ONLY IN THE SPECIFIC INSTANCE AND FOR THE SPECIFIC PURPOSE GIVEN. THERE ARE NO UNDERSTANDINGS, AGREEMENTS, OR REPRESENTATIONS, ORAL OR WRITTEN, NOT SPECIFIED HEREIN REGARDING THIS AGREEMENT.

This agreement, effective on the date signed by the responsible authorities below, will be in effect for a maximum of five years at which time both institutions will undertake to negotiate a new agreement. Due to the dynamic nature of curriculum, the courses comprising this agreement will be reviewed on an annual basis to ensure continued equivalence of course content and student learning outcomes. Furthermore, this agreement is subject to institutional compliance with all state, local, and federal laws as well as compliance with policies of the relevant regional accrediting body (MSCHE).

For Penn Highlands Liberal Arts and Sciences (A.A.) graduates admitted to the UPJ Bachelor degree programs listed on the attached appendices, UPJ will:

1. Transfer the courses and credits as indicated on the individual Program Advising Plan into the relevant UPJ Bachelor degree program on the condition that the individual course grade is C or higher and in accordance with current UPJ transfer credit policies

2. Apply the courses and credits directly to the degree program as outlined so that A.A. graduates may enter at Junior standing with little or no loss of credit.

3. Periodically review the performance of Penn Highlands' graduates who matriculate at UPJ assessing academic preparation and success at UPJ and share these data with Penn Highlands. This information will serve as a metric for evaluating the success of the agreement and grounds for renegotiation of the agreement at the end of the aforementioned five-year period.

As part of this agreement, Penn Highlands and UPJ will:

This agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original, all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument.
